### 1. Background

Water, energy, food and ecosystems are essential resources for human livelihoods and socio-economic development. The use of the **Water-Energy-Food-Ecosystems (WEFE) Nexus approach** enables integrated action for assessing cross-sectoral trade-offs and synergies, optimizing overall security of resources, and facilitating solutions that benefit all sectors, or at least avoid harming the other three sectors when developing activities in each one of them (“no harm principle”). Overall, this enables sustainable management of these resources and facilitates the adaptation to the effects of climate change. In addition, management of water and related natural resources in the **Mediterranean** region, need to take into consideration the **Source to Sea (S2S) continuum** encompassing land, watersheds, aquifers, wetlands, coast and the sea, linked through water, sediment, biota etc., flows, recognizing the interconnectedness of ecosystems, environmental, social, and economic factors along this continuum.

Aiming enhancing system-thinking and inter-disciplinary approaches towards multiple cross-sectorial benefits the **‘Strategy for WEFE Nexus in the Mediterranean Source to Sea continuum’** has been prepared in the frameworks of the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM)<sup>1</sup>, the Barcelona Convention/UNEP MAP<sup>2</sup> and the European Union, and with the technical support of the Global Water Partnership-Mediterranean (GWP-Med)<sup>3</sup>, EU Water & Environment Support (WES) Project<sup>4</sup> and Partnership for Research and Innovation in the Mediterranean Area (PRIMA)<sup>5</sup>. The Strategy proposes a comprehensive strategic framework to assist countries in enhancing policy and action integration across WEFE sectors and to promote leveraging of necessary funding towards sustainability and climate-resilience objectives.

The Strategy has undergone **formal consultations by national governments** in the frameworks of the UfM through the Regional Platform on Water, and of UNEP MAP through the Mediterranean Commission for Sustainable Development. In addition, supported by the GEF UNEP/MAP MedProgramme Child Project 2.2. on WEFE Nexus<sup>6</sup> in synergy with the EU WES Project, PRIMA WEFE4Med and other partners, a **structured regional consultation process** further engaged governments, civil society, financing institutions, academia, etc. This process was launched at the 1st Regional WEFE Nexus Roundtable in the Mediterranean on “Promoting innovation, investments and

upscaling solutions” (6-7 June 2023, Rabat)<sup>7</sup>, and continued at the 2<sup>nd</sup> Regional WEFE Nexus Roundtable ‘Towards a Strategy for WEFE Nexus in the Mediterranean Source to Sea continuum’ (5 February 2024, Tunis, in the margins of the 5<sup>th</sup> Mediterranean Water Forum)<sup>8</sup>.

The Strategy is part of the MSSD (2026-2035) flagship initiative which was adopted at the 24<sup>th</sup> Conference of the Parties (COP24) of the Barcelona Convention (2-5 Dec 2025, Cairo). It was also adopted by the 15<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the UfM Regional Platform on Water (5-6 Nov 2025, Barcelona) in view of the 2<sup>nd</sup> UfM Ministerial Conference on Water (24-25 Mar 2026, Rome).

Among possible results of the UfM 2<sup>nd</sup> Ministerial Meeting on Water, the ‘**Rome Initiative**’ would aim to support the UfM Member States in their renewed ambition and collective commitment to advance towards common climate resilient water goals. Based on that, the Rome Initiative objectives could include facilitating the design, investment planning as well as the accessible and affordable financing of sustainable climate resilience water projects, and fostering the development of the technical capacities and partnerships needed, to address the priorities identified in the Rome UfM Ministerial Declaration.

The Strategy is expected to bring new momentum to efforts for sustainable development in the region. Elaborating a **regional framework for actions (aka Action Framework)** would assist its implementation, including by promoting synergies and identifying ways of leveraging necessary funding. The Action Framework will be aligned with, and support the implementation of, relevant protocols under the Barcelona Convention as well as regional strategic documents, including those of the UfM. Elaborating on possible contents of such an Action Framework would be fostered by collecting inputs of stakeholders as well as by becoming informed of and aligned with related regional thematic WEFE Nexus consultations and action lines.

Among means of elaborating and implementing an Action Framework for the Strategy, the **WEFE Nexus Community of Practice (NCoP)**<sup>9</sup> can assist providing a collaborative platform to connect stakeholders, facilitate knowledge exchange and capacity building, and support dissemination of WEFE solutions in the Mediterranean. The WEFE Nexus NCoP has its origins in the recommendations of the 2021 ‘WEFE Nexus Science Advances Conference’<sup>10</sup>, organized in Nicosia and online by the EU Joint Research Centre (JRC), UfM, PRIMA, and The Cyprus Institute (Cyl)<sup>11</sup>, that highlighted science’s pivotal role as a driver of innovation and the importance of the science-policy interface to advance sustainable resource management. Since then, the Mediterranean region has witnessed a significant number of WEFE Nexus projects, processes and initiatives, including those supported by the European Commission Directorate General for Research & Innovation<sup>12</sup> and PRIMA. The PRIMA-funded WEFE4MED Project supports the WEFE Nexus NCoP, that was launched in 2024, facilitating the identification, testing, and dissemination of Nexus solutions while showcasing their benefits to policymakers and stakeholders through specific case studies.

Rooted in these recent and upcoming key developments within regional policy institutions and their processes, and building on the foundations of previous regional multi-stakeholder events, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Mediterranean WEFE Nexus Roundtable (Conference), would contribute to charting a course forward from Strategy-to-Action for the sustainable management of the WEFE resources through the Nexus approach in the Mediterranean Source to Sea Continuum. This would also directly address challenges

of the climate crisis, linking to regional efforts like the Eastern Mediterranean and Middle East Climate Change Initiative (EMME-CCI)<sup>13</sup>. Furthermore, its recommendations will contribute to related thematic areas of the 6<sup>th</sup> Euro-Mediterranean Water Forum (29 Sept-2 Oct 2026, Rome) and other regional and international fora.

## 2. Objectives and expected Outcomes

The Conference will promote multi-stakeholder efforts towards action for the integrated management of natural resources as well as water, food and energy security and environmental sustainability by enabling the implementation of the WEFE Nexus Strategy in the Mediterranean Source to Sea Continuum. In that context, the Conference will:

- Elaborate on technical contents of an Action Framework to foster the WEFE Nexus Strategy implementation, ensuring it is operationally aligned with the upcoming Rome Initiative.
- Demonstrate application of the WEFE Nexus and the Source to Sea approaches in the region by highlighting relevant policy and governance developments, measurable outcomes of pilot activities, innovation driven by digital transformation, and scalability achieved through investment/financing mobilization, among other aspects.
- Elaborate on advancing design of WEFE Nexus investments and access to financing.
- Elaborate on aligning the WEFE Nexus framework with the Eastern Mediterranean and Middle East Climate Change Initiative, aiming for the integration of climate resilience-related action in the region, and other regional initiatives.

Expected outcomes include:

- A Nexus multi-stakeholder consultation process established, initiating work for shaping the Strategy's Action Framework, including linked with the upcoming Rome Initiative.
- Collaboration through the Mediterranean WEFE Nexus CoP fostered, including towards reinforcing the link between science, policy, and finance for actionable outcomes.
- The regional WEFE Nexus agenda and climate resilience objectives enhanced and aligned with the EMME-CCI and other related regional processes.

## 4. Target Participants

Aimed participants include: Governments; Local authorities; Civil society, youth, and community-based organizations; Scientists and researchers; Practitioners; International institutions, regional organizations and networks; International financing institutions and national development banks; Multilateral and bilateral development partners; Private sector; Media

## 5. Organization and Support

The Conference will take place on 24-26 February 2026, at the Cyprus Institute, in Nicosia, Cyprus, and online (Hybrid). It is held under the auspices of the 2026 Cyprus Presidency of the EU, within the frameworks of UNEP MAP, UfM, and PRIMA, and in the context and with the support of the GEF UNEP MAP MedProgramme and the PRIMA WEFE4MED Project (Nexus Community of Practice - NCoP) and contribution from GEF IWLEARN. It is organised by the Global Water Partnership – Mediterranean and the Cyprus Institute, in synergy with the EU WES BCA Project.
